Some **international travel** regulations require a *Minor Travel Consent Form* for minors to be permitted on international flights and/or to immigrate unless their parent(s) or guardian(s) accompany the minor. This form gives authorities and foreign officials proof that a minor has consent from his or her parent(s) or guardian(s) to travel with an adult who is not a relative. It is meant to prevent hassle, delays, and cancellations at each checkpoint in the travel process.

{The parent should travel with a notarized true copy of a court order or equivalent proving custody.}

"Sole custody" means that only one parent/guardian has the right to make decisions affecting the minor (e.g. schooling, health care, etc.) "Joint custody" means that both parents have the right to participate in making these kinds of decisions. Parents may have joint custody even if the minor resides with only one parent.

Signing Details

In case there should be any question, we recommend that parents carry one of the following documents as proof of their relation to the child: 1. An original birth certificate issued by a state, city, or county (Hospital birth certificates are not acceptable.) 2. A certified copy of a birth certificate issued by a city, county, or state and which has a raised seal. 3. The original or certified copy of the Consular Report of Birth Abroad (FS-240) 4. The original or certified copy of the Certification of Birth Abroad (DS- 1350). 5. The original or certified copy of the court Adoption decree.

Whatever documentation is used should show the names of both parents, thus proving their relation to the child. When traveling with minor children, remember that the airlines are very careful and they will err on the side of caution; protecting themselves from any liability when deciding to allow a minor to board an international flight.
